### R & D FUNCTION IN NGOS AND CHURCH RELATED BODIES

The **R & D Department** is the **heart** of any growing organization.

In an industrial setting R & D gives direction towards introducing of new and improved products, identifying new markets, offering new approaches, like '**Blue Ocean Strategy**', and developing new expertise.

In **army and defence**, R & D focuses on new strategies, new weapons, and when this function is applied to an **NGO, Education, or Religious Organization** it may focus on different topics, like reality assessment, new frontier ministries, enhanced decision making, and policy formulation processes, new clientele, improved approaches and interventions in different ministries, new and more relevant packages of programs and services.

When different disciplines and charism are engaged in looking at realities from Evangelical and Charismatic perspectives, their reading would be different; their interpretations would be more authentic.

Change, innovation, and continuous improvement are live words today. Innovations and discoveries are built on R & D.

**R & D is the bedrock for policy formulation, decision making, and timely & adequate legal interventions.** It provides data, both quantitative, and qualitative. Such data becomes the base for launching new programs and

It challenges and provides opening towards new frontiers. New Frontiers may be in geographical terms, in terms of different and more urgent clientele, in terms of introducing new and more relevant programs and services, and new competencies.

In our Salesian World we have seen efforts of this type in action. Mention may be made in geographical terms, of Project Africa, Project Europe, and Rural Youth ministry in Tamil Nadu. **In terms of new clientele we may consider the focus in favour of the 'Young at Risk'.** In terms of programs and services, examples of Skilling India, Youth Animation Packages developed based on the research conducted on the psychological needs of the youth, are just a couple of outcomes of research.

R & D brings in changes both mini and radical in the areas of formation and training of personnel in religious circles, in the defence forces, in industry and business, in Trade Unions, etc.

Experimental researches, longitudinal studies, action researches and other types of researches provide veracity, and effectiveness of the current interventions.

Statistics on the organization when supplied to "R & D" department, it can express the state of the industry, the degree of competition, or the lure of progress.

**In general it is the opinion that there is a positive relationship between research and development in any growing organization.** When research is of high quality it produce knowledge that is applicable beyond the research setting. Such results of empirical researches have significant implications for policy formulation and project implementation.

Well-conducted research is vital to the success of programs developed, and policies formulated. When research is empirical, and of course, theory based, it has great coercive power.

**In non-profit organizations, R & D usually means focussing on researching issues that affect the clients, and the mission of the organization. Here it is not profit that is the assessment factor, but the satisfaction of the clients, and meeting their needs, as well as the fulfilment of the Mission entrusted to the organization.** Side by side efforts are made to develop alternative solutions which have wider reach-out, and within the reach of the poor and the marginalized, and at the same time of high quality and effectiveness.



**Churches and Religious Congregations should have a Research and Development Department at national level, and later may be at regional and provincial levels.**

It is a forum for dreaming, where nothing is impossible, and no thought is outrageous. It keeps expanding and reaching out to the People of God in newer ways of doing, with greater efficiency and more effectiveness. Church related bodies are slow, in general, in areas of creativity and experimentation. The Second Vatican Council was, indeed, a breakthrough effort in moving towards a greater integration of Mastery and Mystery.

**R & D Department at DB ARK is constantly engaged in research studies on Youth, Education, Religious Congregations, NGOs, Welfare and Developmental Projects. 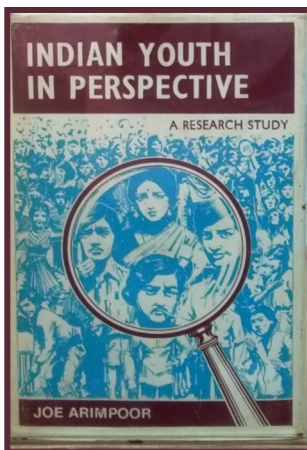
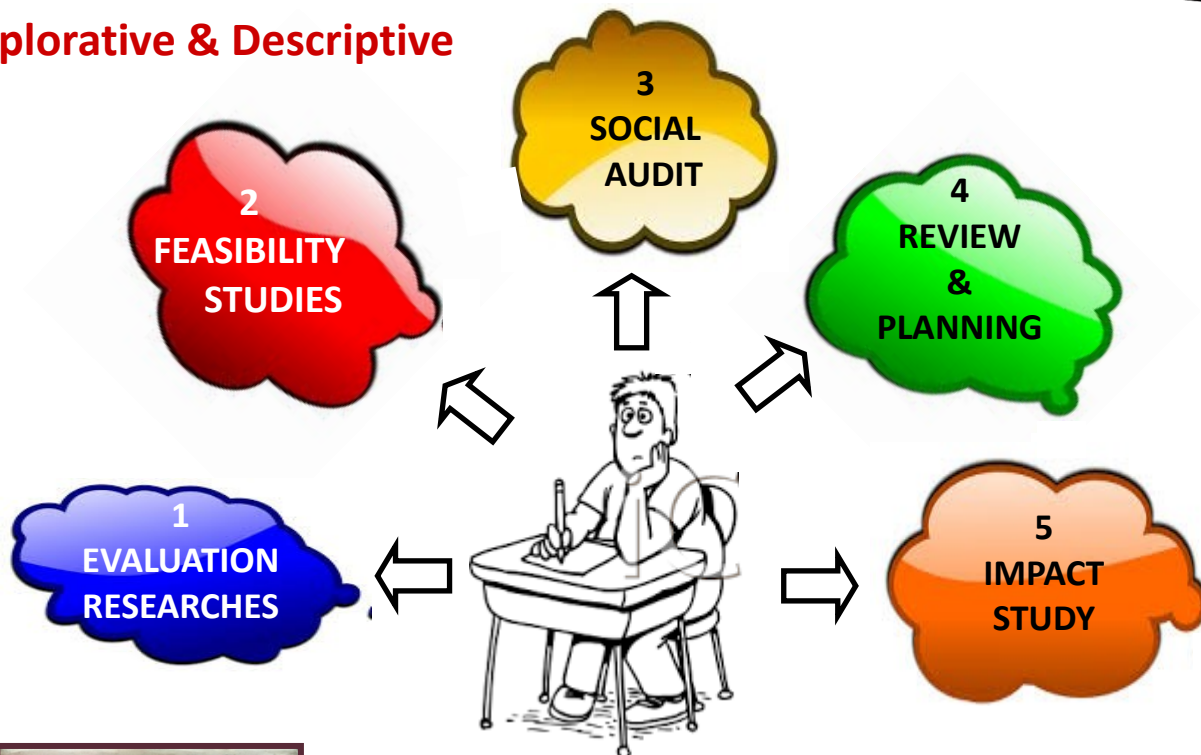

#### I. Explorative & Descriptive



A comprehensive study of  
5000 youth in India  
Their Values, Attitudes, Problems,  
and Semantic differences in focus

Many researches are available on demographic data on youth, and descriptive studies on precipitating events related to youth unrest and reaction. But an introspective study as "Indian Youth in Perspective" is rare.

This study has served as baseline data for further researches as well as policy formulation even at the National level. Fr. Joe was able to make his contribution from the findings of this study to the National Youth Policy when he was a member of National Youth Council of India.
